

Dundee lived up to its status as Scotland's sunniest city when approx. 30 delegates visited the University of Dundee on 31st August 2017 for a one-day workshop titled "Employability, Enterprise and Entrepreneurship (the 3Es) in the Life Sciences", which was kindly supported by funds from The Society.

Delegates included academics, careers advisers and organisations that represent employers in the Biosciences sector, and the day consisted of short oral presentations, two keynote presentations and stimulating group discussion. The day proved an excellent opportunity to share good practice and network with colleagues from across the UK and further afield.

Presentations covered a range of topics linked to the 3Es, including: How can we increase awareness of employability amongst our students? How best can we embed elements related to the 3Es in our undergraduate curricula? How can our graduates best promote and demonstrate evidence for their range of skills and competencies as they seek employment or postgraduate study?

Keynote presentations were delivered by Dr Julia Choate, Monash University, Australia ("Using a professional development programme to enhance undergraduate career development and employability"), and Dr Ronnie Palin, Skills Development Scotland ("Skills Planning in Scotland").
